SOUND THEOLOGY

Colossians 3:16 is a crucial passage for understanding the role of music in the church: “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.” Here, Paul reminds Christians that music in gathered worship is a means of teaching God’s truth. It shows us that God’s word dwells in us (richly, even!) as a result of singing together.

I often speak about how important it is for our songs to contain solid theology. If we teach each other by singing together, we have a great responsibility to sing truth: not half-truths or confusing truths, but clear, biblical precepts. Yet this task isn’t merely academic and technical. It is a joyful exercise in encouragement.

Here’s an example I learned about recently that shows how careful attention to the lyrics we sing can teach us wonderful things. One of the original verses (omitted in most hymnals) of “All Creatures of Our God and King” is this:

*And thou most kind and gentle Death,
Waiting to hush our latest breath,
O praise Him! Alleluia!
Thou leadest home the child of God,
And Christ our Lord the way hath trod.*

Here, we are invited to consider how even death is redeemed to the praise of our triune God. Death is a consequence of sin; it could not praise God because it only brought separation from His goodness (Is. 38:18). It is a terrible and hopeless thing apart from the work of Christ. But we now know that Christ has defeated death by his resurrection, and that Christians will be raised to reign with Him. Death has no final hold over God’s children, yet we all experience death in this present age as the effects of sin continue to ravage us.

So how should Christians think of death in this present age, where death is defeated but still persists? Death is not the final word, and it can now be viewed in a much different light. Recall Paul’s attitude in Philippians 1:18-26, particularly verse 21: “to live is Christ, and to die is gain.” There is a certain positive effect that death has – namely, our eternal communion with our Redeemer.

This is how the Christian should view death: kindly and gently ushering the children of God into our eternal home because of the work that Christ has done on our behalf. O praise Him, Death, indeed!

NEW YEAR’S RESOLUTIONS

Jonathan Edwards was perhaps the greatest American preacher/theologian. Among his many famous contributions to the church, he published a series of personal resolutions that would guide his life. 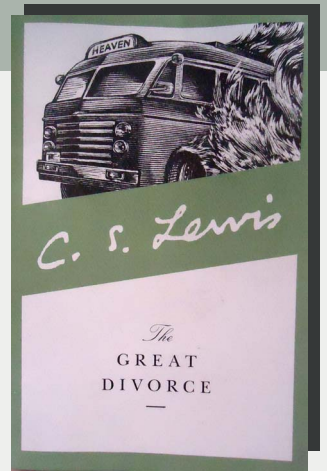

C. S. Lewis: *The Great Divorce*

Lewis' masterful look at heaven and hell isn't so much a precise discourse in the theology of the afterlife, but is instead a stirring devotional reminder of the important choices Christians face each day. The truth is that we often value our sin more than we value God. Lewis reminds us with imaginative beauty that "There are only two kinds of people in the end: those who say to God, 'Thy will be done,' and those to whom God says, in the end, 'Thy will be done.'" 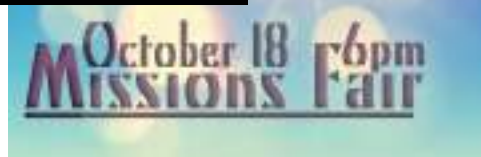
