MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

At FBC Lindale, we believe that becoming a member of a local church is an important part of the Christian life. However, for many Christians the idea of membership seems to take one of two forms. It is either completely rejected as some type of unnecessary and extra-biblical practice, or it is little more than a tradition with no real meaning. This has resulted in many Christians completely neglecting any formal approach to becoming a member of a local church. In fact, current statistics show that few people believe that church membership is necessary. No wonder so many Christians hop from church to church or attend a church indefinitely without ever considering joining.

Part of the problem is that many churches have not practiced meaningful membership. For too many, membership means little more than walking down an aisle, signing a card, and being voted in. I can think of many reasons why I would also be against this sort of membership. Membership in a church should not be about bragging rights for how many members it has, or a means of increasing the financial bottom line of the church, or similar to joining a club in the community. If we are going to have membership in our church, it must reflect what we see in the churches of the New Testament in a meaningful way.

One might ask, "Where do we see church membership taught anywhere in the Bible?"

If we claim to be a church governed by the Word of God, why would we practice something that is not taught in Scripture?" Notice that the question itself has a major presumption behind it – namely, that the Bible doesn't teach membership. If true, I would agree that it would be wrong to practice any form of membership in the church. As a pastor, I have no right to bind the conscience of anyone beyond the clear teachings of God's Word.

Therefore, on January 11 we will begin a sermon series entitled "Membership Matters." We will examine God's Word together to understand exactly what the Bible teaches on this important topic. This is Christ's church and we need to submit ourselves to him if we are going to walk as his people in this world. I believe this will be one of the most important sermon series I have ever taught at FBC. We will carefully examine why church membership is absolutely a New Testament practice, what meaningful membership in a church should look like, why we have the process we do at FBC for membership, and what the expectations for each of us should be as members of a local church.

Pray with me as I prepare and we take this important journey as a church. Please commit to being here for the "Membership Matters" series whether you find yourself in favor of membership, against it, or somewhere in the middle.

JOY TO THE WORLD! THE LORD IS COME!

The Bible says in Luke 2:10-11, “And the angel said to them, ‘Fear not, for behold I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day a Savior who is Christ the Lord.’” Until the close of the seventeenth century, the bulk of church music consisted of metrical versions of the Psalms. Then, on July 17, 1674, a young man by the name of Isaac Watts was born, whom God used greatly to emphasize hymn-singing. His father was a minister in Southampton, England, and one day, as a young man, he returned from church to complain to his father about the state of Psalm singing in the church. His father replied, “Try then, whether you can yourself to produce something better.” Try he did, and during his lifetime wrote more than six hundred hymns. However, in 1719, while putting the book of Psalms into rhyming meter for worship, he came to Psalm 98, and overwhelmed by its prophetic reference to the coming Messiah as Savior, he wrote:

Joy to the world! The Lord is come! Let
earth receive her king;
Let every heart prepare Him room, and
Heaven and nature sing,
Joy to the earth! The Savior reigns!
Let men their songs employ;
While fields and floods, rocks hills and plains,
Repeat the sounding joy.

Psalm 98:4 says, “Make a Joyful noise to the Lord all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises!” This Christmas, may we rejoice and sing, “JOY TO THE WORLD! THE LORD IS COME!”



DON'T BLINK OR YOU'LL MISS IT

Sometimes I find myself thinking, “I really don't have time for this right now.” But I always remind myself that the opportunity might not come around again, at least not where they are asking the questions of me. Make time for the most important things in life.

THE TRUTH, THE WHOLE TRUTH, AND NOTHING BUT THE TRUTH

One principle of Bible interpretation that we often champion at FBC is this: *Hold the Line of Scripture*. Christians have a tendency to either shy away from the full truth of the Bible, thus coming up short of the line of Scripture – or, we say more than what the Word actually teaches, going beyond that line.

Consider these examples. Sometimes we try to make light of sin, calling our transgressions “mistakes” or “goofs.” This does not do justice to what Jesus calls “evil” and “hating the light” (John 3:19-20). It shies away from the line of Scripture, thus not really teaching the whole truth. Other times, we try to make the Bible say things it doesn't really say, like suggesting that you can dunk a basketball if you have enough faith (the context of Philippians 4:13 clearly shows that the verse refers to life in plentiful and difficult times). This is going beyond the line of Scripture, thus teaching more than the truth.

Unfortunately, Christians stay below or go above the line of Scripture in our singing, too. Some songs don't say enough about their own subject matter; others say more than we should care to affirm. Here are two examples from Christmas music, since the season for them is upon us.

Think about this lyric: “Christmas is all in the heart; that's where the feeling starts. And like a fire inside, it touches every part, 'cause Christmas is all in the heart.” Triteness aside, the song totally misses the point of Christmas. The reason we celebrate Christ's birth is because it marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry and redemptive work on this earth! While our hearts should be full of all sorts of emotions in reaction to this story, the essence of Christmas is Jesus himself, not how we feel about the season. This lyric falls short of the line of Scripture.

The opposite error is equally dangerous. Consider this line in *Away in a Manger*: “The little Lord Jesus, no crying He makes.” Where did we get that idea? The Bible does not teach that Jesus never cried. The Scriptures reveal that Jesus was fully human and fully divine, so it is reasonable to expect him to cry as an infant, since part of the significance of the incarnation is that Christ would taste our suffering as a man. In fact, there are some hymnologists who believe that this phrase was intentionally written to call into question Jesus' humanity. This lyric goes beyond the line of Scripture.

You might say I'm splitting hairs here, but I'm not comfortable singing something as a church about our Lord that weakens the truth of the Bible or says more than we should. Let's work to ensure that we don't go beyond the Bible's truth, and that we don't shy away from singing its fullness. Let's commit anew to sing the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth.

THE PERFECT RELATIONSHIP (PT. 2)

In the previous newsletter, I wrote about the perfect relationship. I said that when our relationships get out of tune, we often look to the relationships around us to try and get back in tune. Unfortunately, we often fail to look to the perfect relationship in order to learn how we should pattern our relationships.

The perfect relationship is the one that exists among our Trinitarian God. The Bible teaches that there is only one God (Deut. 6:4), but this one God exists as three Persons. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct Persons, yet each Person is fully God. Thus we have this eternally perfect relationship that we can look to in order to learn key lessons for how we should pattern our relationships.

Previously, we discovered the important lesson that relationships are good. We were created in God's image; therefore, we were created for relationships. We are intended to be connected with one another in community, just as God exists in community. We learn from the perfect relationship that we should value our relationships with our families, with our friends, and with our church.

A second lesson we learn from this perfect relationship is the importance of both unity and diversity. Consider the diversity that exists among the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each Person has a unique role He serves. We see this unique role expressed in both creation and redemption. For example, in redemption the Father is the One who plans and directs our salvation (Eph. 1:3-6). The Father sends the Son, and the Son submits to the Father's plan (John 3:16). The Son serves the unique role of accomplishing our redemption through his life and death (Eph. 1:7-12). The Son is given the name above all other names (Phil. 2:9). The Spirit serves the unique role of applying the work of Christ to us (Eph. 1:13-14). The Spirit seals us and unites us with Christ so that we can stand forgiven and redeemed before the Father.

Notice the diversity of God and how each Person of the Trinity has a unique and distinct role. Yet consider the unity of God and how each Person of the Trinity has the exact same purpose and goal. All three Persons of the Trinity are equally God, and all three Persons of the Trinity work together to accomplish the same plan, namely our redemption (Eph 1:3-14).

We should learn from this perfect relationship. We need diversity and unity in our relationships and in our church. We need people who are different from us. We need people who have different gifts and personalities. We are not called to be identical to one another, and we should celebrate the diversity that exists among us.

At the same time, we must make sure we are using our diverse gifts and personalities to build unity around the same goals and purposes. We must make every effort - no matter how difficult - to get on the same page with one another (Rom. 12:18). The five most talented musicians in the world will sound terrible if they are all playing at the same time, but they are not playing together.

Do your relationships pattern and reflect the perfect relationship? Do you embrace and celebrate diversity in your relationships? Are you on the same page in your relationships? Are you contributing

your unique talents and personality and gifting to the church? Are you on the same page with the leadership and direction of the church? Let the Trinity be the tuner for all your relationships.

LET'S WORSHIP

In case you missed it, just a few weeks ago, I preached during the Sunday evening service. The text was Psalm 100, which says,

¹ Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth!

² Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!

³ Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name!

⁵ For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.

Here is the Reader's Digest version of that sermon. In verse one, when it says to make a joyful noise, it means to shout; to shout for victory, as the Israelites did when they took the city of Jericho. The word "serve" in verse two can be translated to mean "worship." Verse one and two tell the Israelites then (and us now) to shout and worship the Lord with gladness. Why? Verse three gives us that answer...because The Lord is God. His kingship is worthy of our shouts and songs of glad praise.

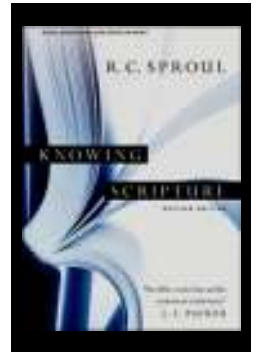
Verse four tells us to enter his gates and courts with praise and to give thanks. Why? Verse five answers that. Because the Lord is good. Because his steadfast love endures forever and his faithfulness to all generations.

Notice that the Psalm doesn't say that we should worship with gladness because our music is in a certain style that we like, or because we sing certain songs. It tells us to worship the Lord with gladness and thanksgiving because the Lord is God and because he is good.

In KidsCore on Sunday evenings, we try to stress that point with the children. We want them to see the truths from Scripture about who God is in the songs that we sing and be excited about that. We want them to worship because of those truths. If your child isn't joining us for KidsCore on Sunday evenings, then let's get started! You'll love it, and they will too!

RECOMMENDED READING: *KNOWING SCRIPTURE* (R. C. SPROUL) REVIEW BY CHRIS MOORE



In his book, *Knowing Scripture*, R. C. Sproul provides some practical tools for how to accurately study and understand God's Word. He provides reasons for why a person should study, gives historical perspective, and shares some resources. The bulk of the book (and the best part of the book) is about the basic principles a person should follow in Bible study. For example, he talks a lot about using Scripture to interpret other Scripture. Regarding R. C. Sproul, J. I. Packer says, "The Bible excites him and his excitement is infectious." If you want to learn to study the Bible or go deeper in your study, *Knowing Scripture* would be a great resource.

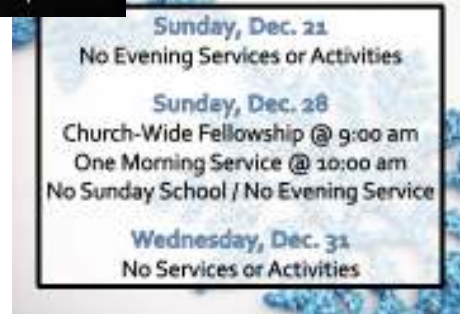

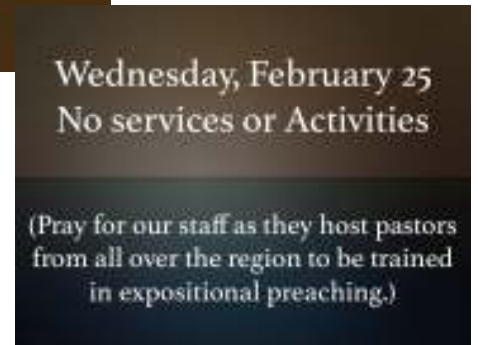
